

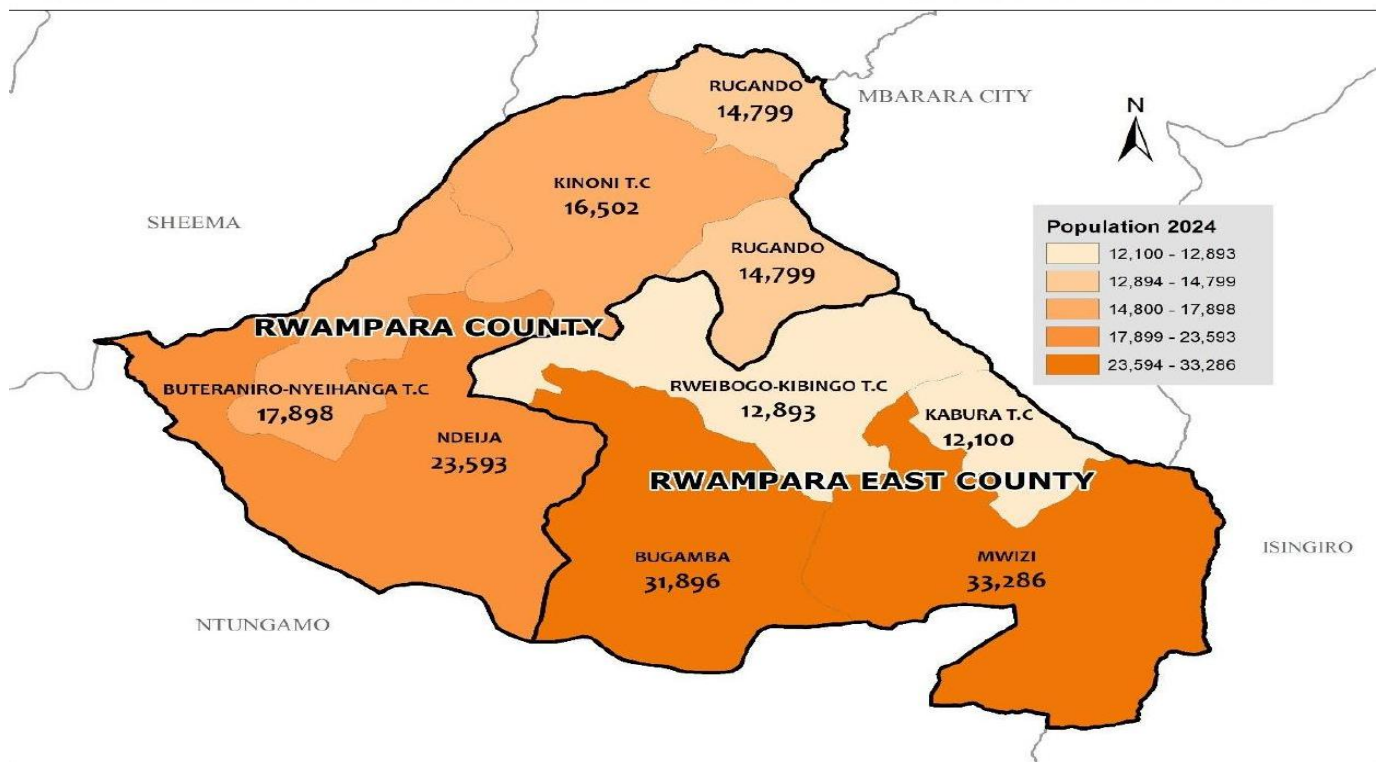

## GLOSSARY OF TERMS

---

**Special Age Groups:** Children Under-5 (0–4 yrs); Children 0–17 yrs; Primary school-age 6–12 yrs; Secondary school-age 13–18 yrs; Adults 18+ yrs; Working-age 14–64 yrs (national) / 15+ yrs (international); Youth 18–30 yrs (national) / 15–24 yrs (international); Older persons 60+ yrs (national) / 65+ yrs (international); Persons eligible for SAGE 80+ yrs.

**Health Insurance:** An agreement between the insured and an insurance company where the company agrees to cover certain medical benefits including testing, drugs, and treatment services.

**Mental Health Disorder:** A psychiatric condition characterised by disturbances in cognition, emotion, or behaviour. Includes: Probable Anxiety Disorder; Probable Depressive Disorder; Probable Psychosis; Probable Bipolar Affective Disorder; Probable Suicidality.

**Unemployment Rate:** Proportion of unemployed persons to the total labour force (ILO 19th ICLS definition).

**NEET:** Youth Not in Employment, Education, or Training — youth not engaged in any employment, formal education, or vocational training.

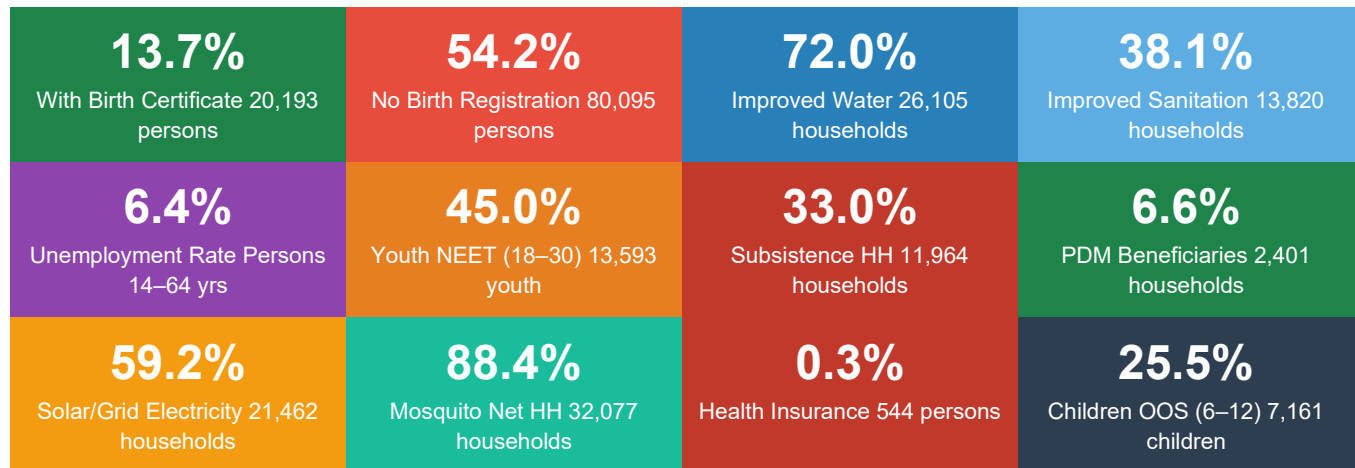
**Improved Water Source:** Sources protected from contamination: piped water, boreholes, protected springs, rainwater.

**Improved Sanitation:** Toilet facility not shared with other households: flush/pour-flush toilets, pit latrines with slabs, ventilated improved pit latrines, composting toilets.

**Subsistence Economy:** System where households produce primarily for own consumption with minimal surplus; households unable to satisfy basic food and non-food needs.

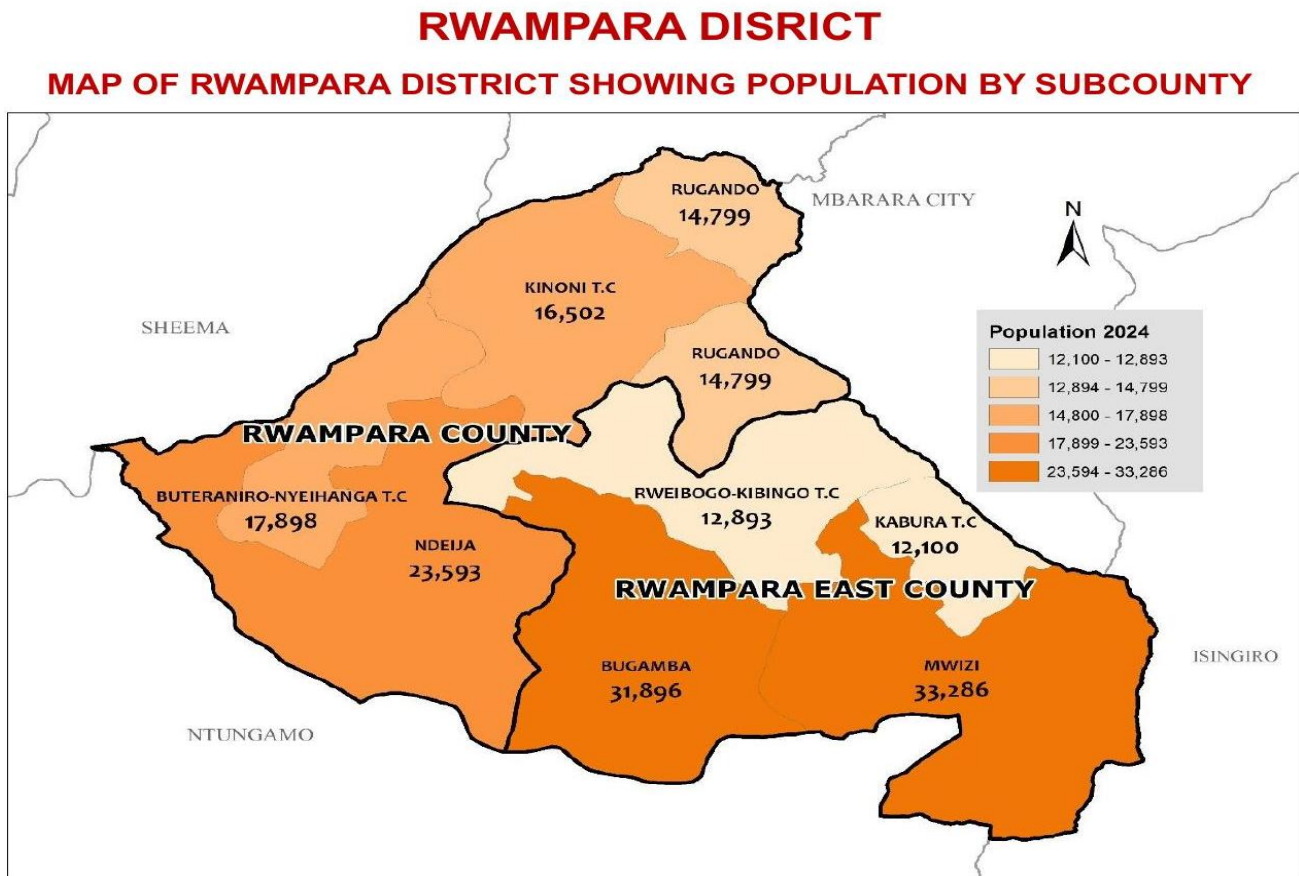

# MAP OF RWAMPARA DISTRICT SHOWING POPULATION BY SUBCOUNTY

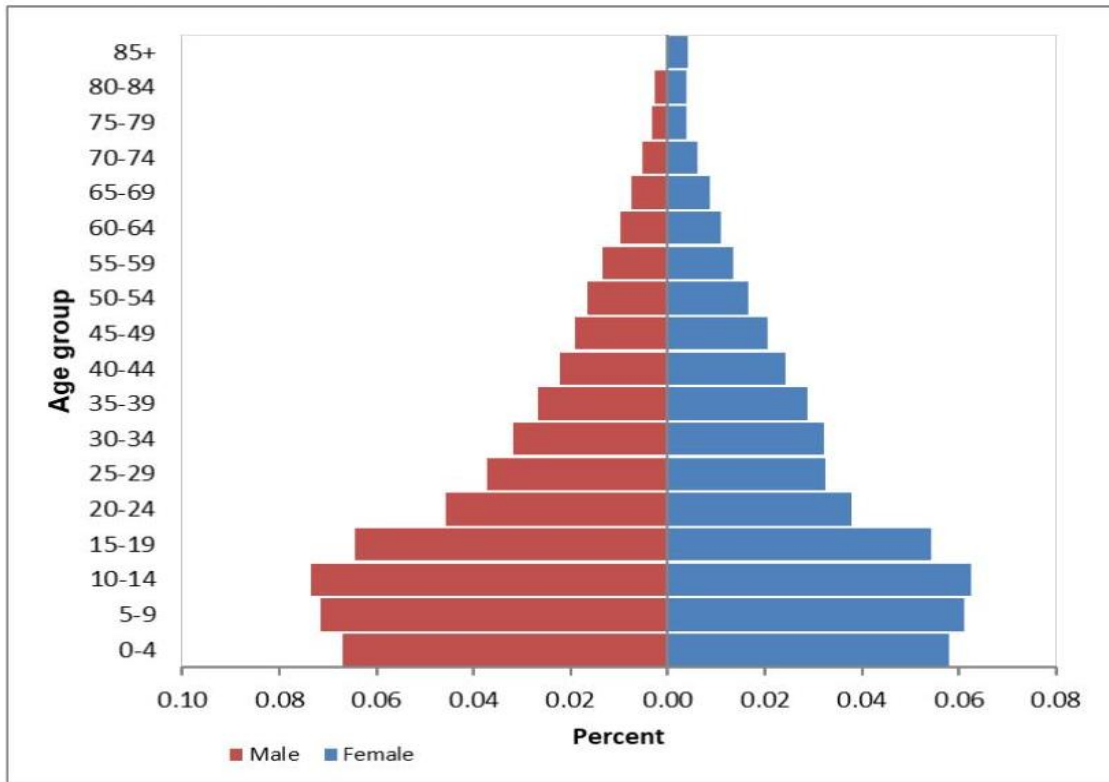

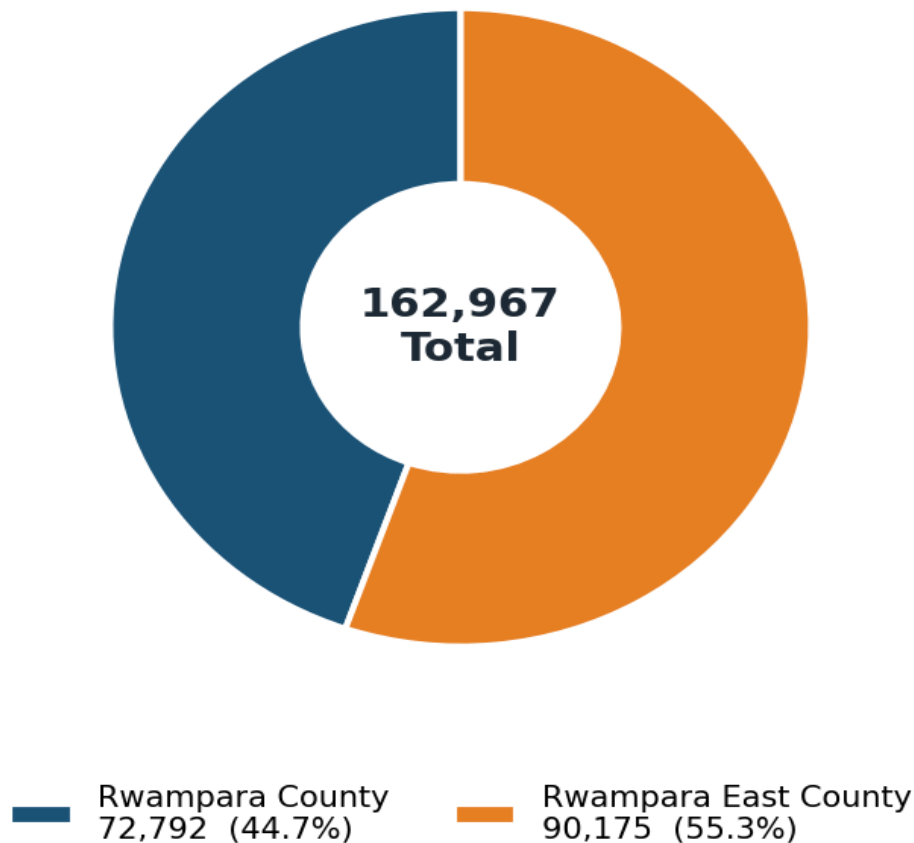
# 1. POPULATION SIZE AND DISTRIBUTION

Rwampara District recorded a total population of 162,967 persons in the 2024 National Population and Housing Census, comprising 84,812 males (52.0%) and 78,155 females (48.0%). The district has two counties — Rwampara County with 72,792 persons and Rwampara East County with 90,175 persons. Rwampara East County is more populous, accounting for 55.3% of the district's total population.

*Figure 1: Population Distribution by County — Rwampara District, 2024*

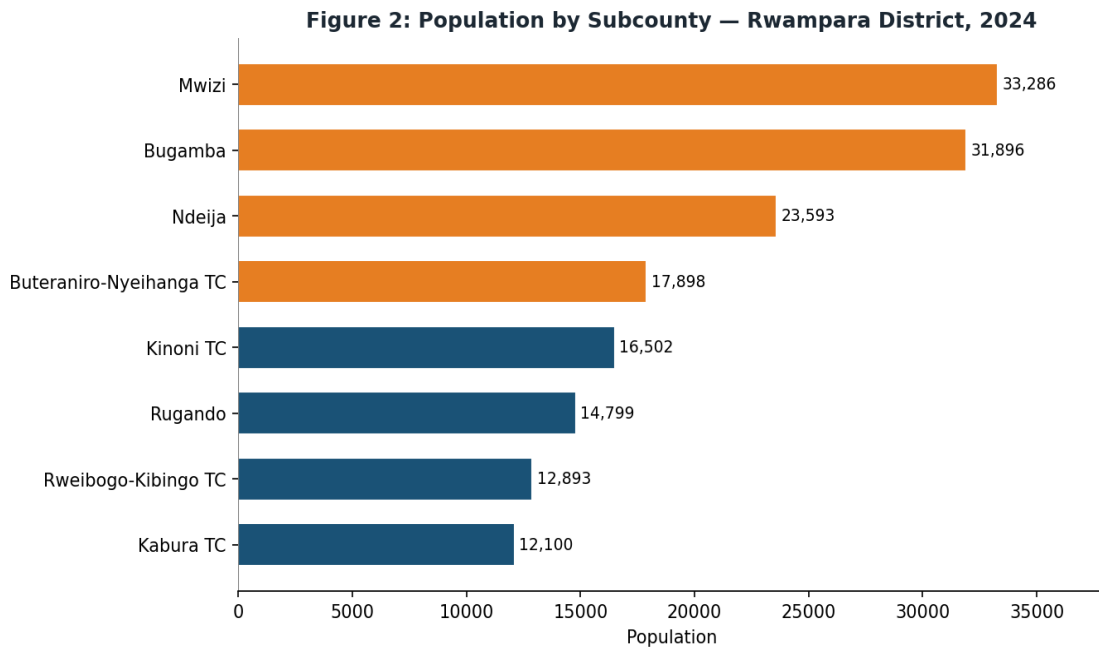
**Figure 1: Population Distribution by County

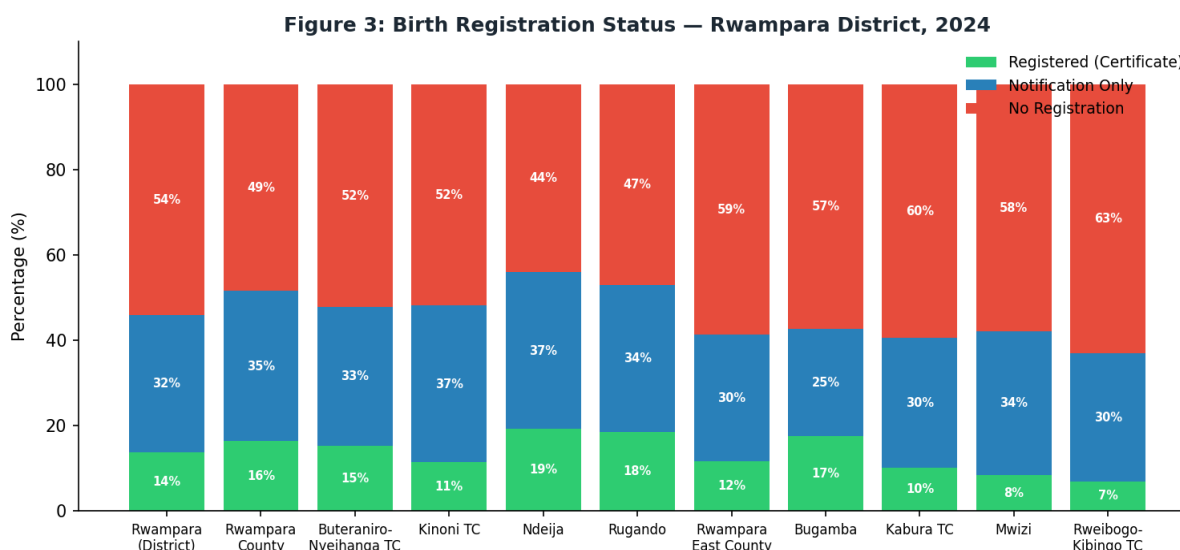

## 2. BIRTH REGISTRATION

Birth registration data reveals that out of 147,801 household population, only 20,193 (13.7%) were registered with a birth certificate, while 47,513 (32.1%) had notification only. A significant 80,095 (54.2%) had no registration at all, indicating a major civil registration gap requiring urgent policy attention. Rwampara East County has a significantly higher proportion of unregistered persons compared to Rwampara County.

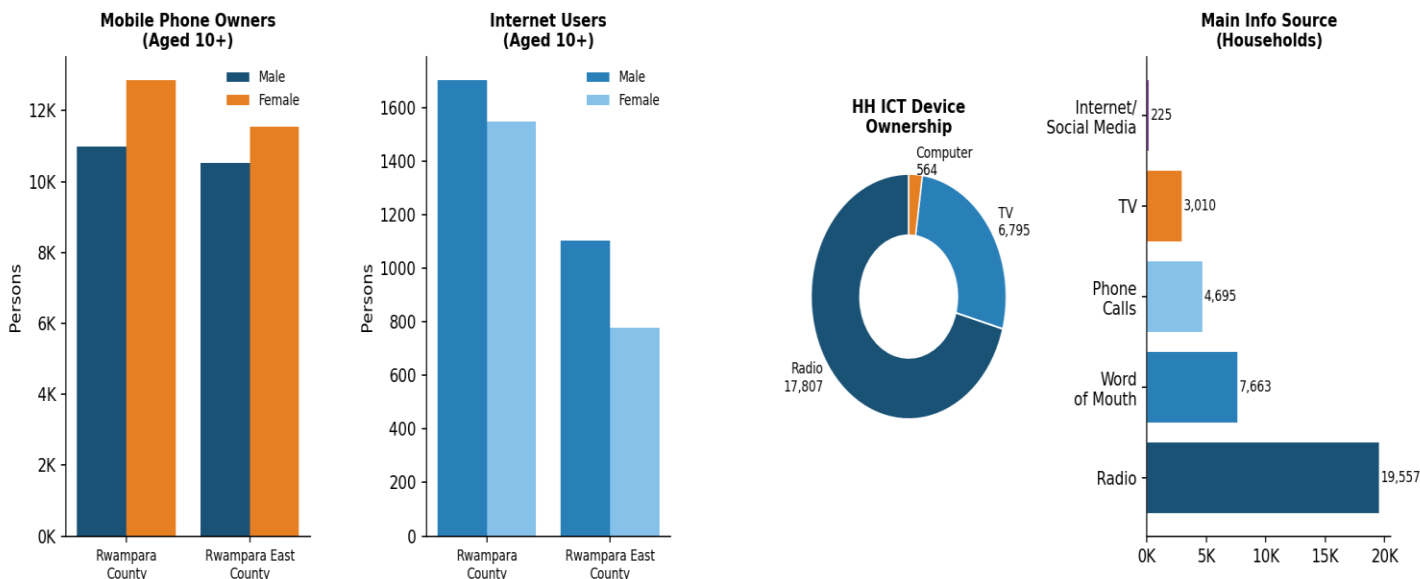

### 3. ICT ACCESS AND DIGITAL CONNECTIVITY

Access to information and communication technology is a key enabler of development. Rwampara District had 45,923 mobile phone owners among persons aged 10 and above (21,500 male; 24,423 female), with female ownership slightly exceeding male. Internet usage remains low at 5,137 persons. Radio remains the dominant source of information, with 19,557 households (53.9%) relying on it as their primary source.

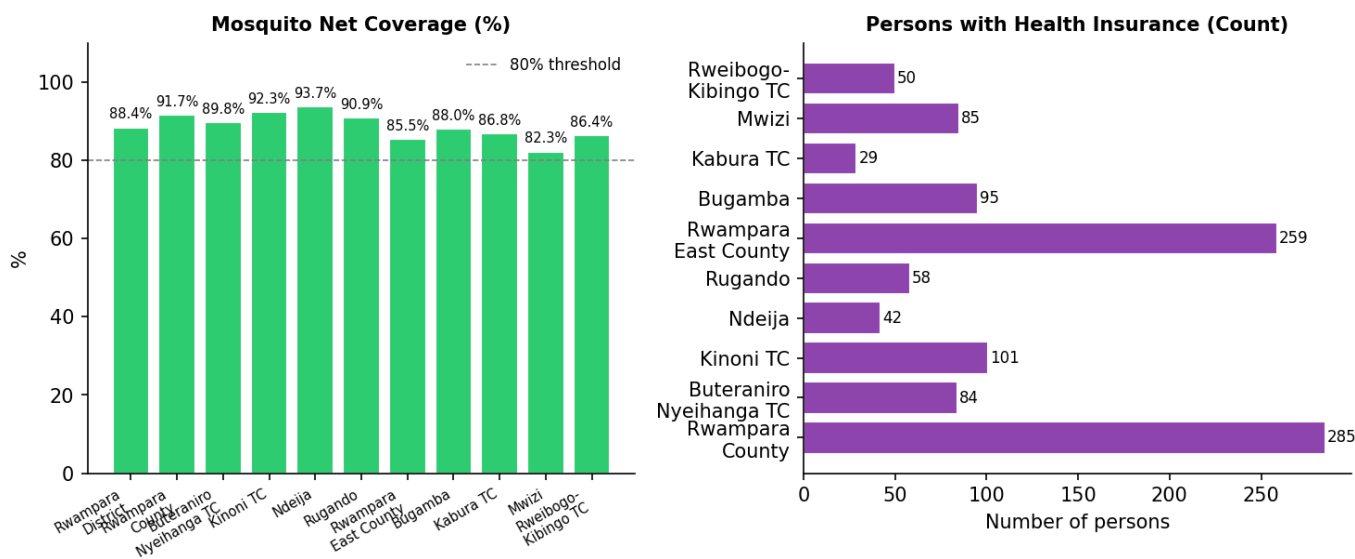
## 4. HEALTH AND WELLBEING

### 4.1 Mosquito Net Ownership and Health Insurance

A total of 32,077 households (88.4%) owned at least one mosquito net, indicating high net coverage across the district. However, health insurance coverage was extremely low, with only 544 persons (0.3% of the population) having any form of health insurance — a major policy concern for healthcare financing in the district.

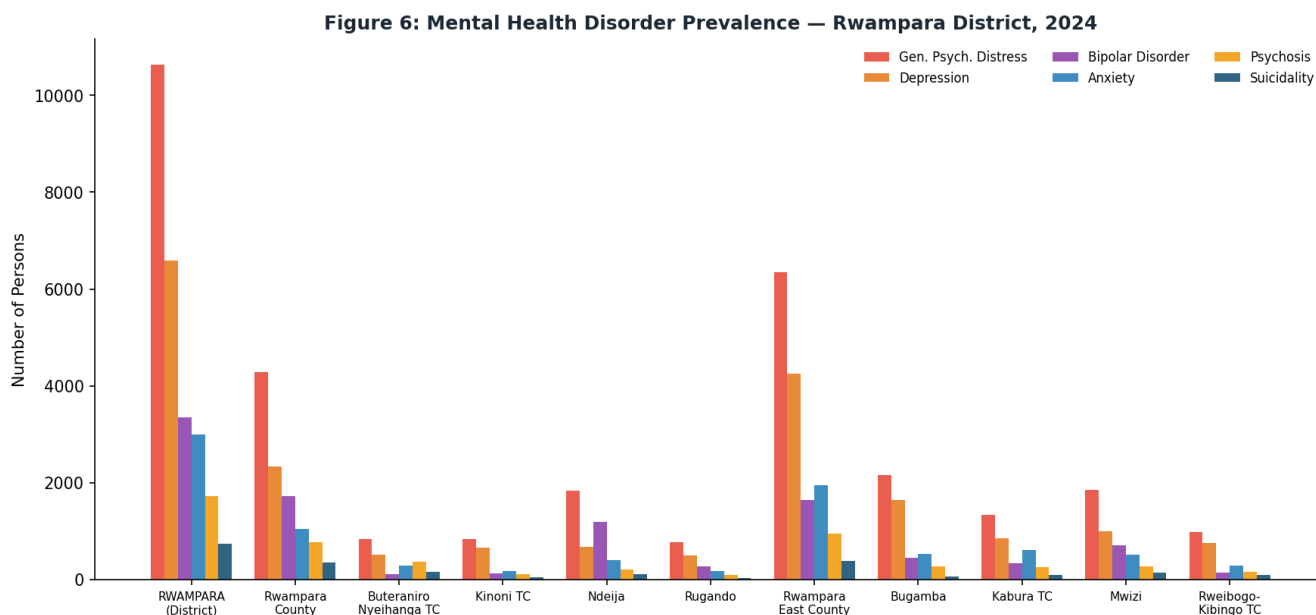

## 4.2 Mental Health

Mental health disorders present a significant challenge in Rwampara District. A total of 10,633 persons showed probable general psychological distress, 6,585 probable depression, 3,356 probable bipolar affective disorder, 3,001 probable anxiety, 1,718 probable psychosis, and 744 probable suicidality. Rwampara East County accounts for 59.6% of all mental health cases in the district.

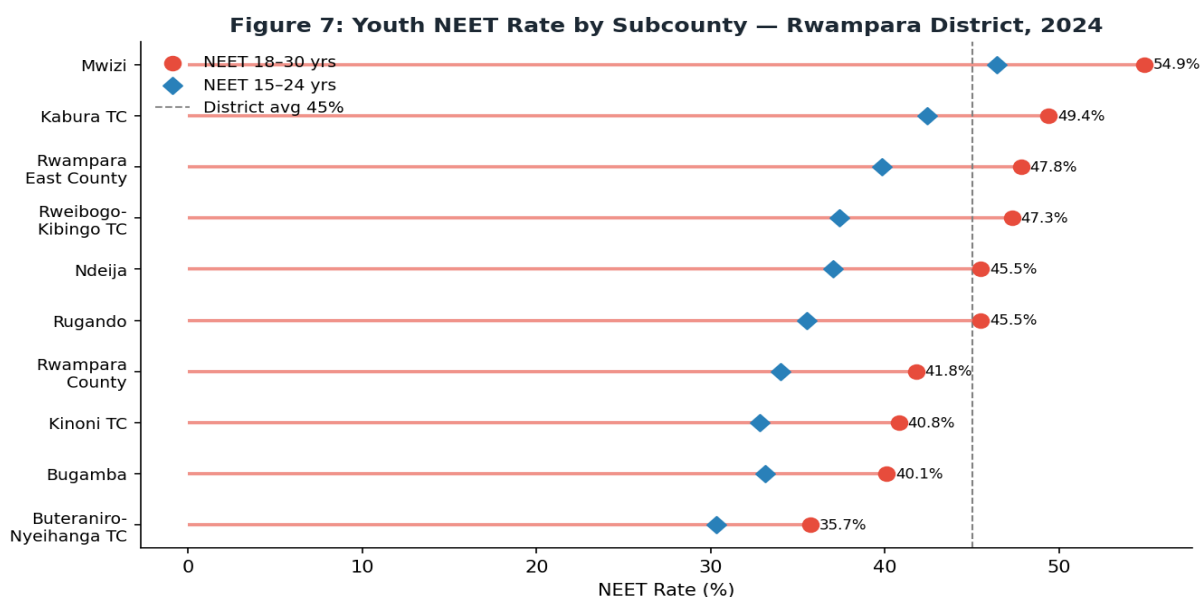

## 5. LABOUR FORCE AND EMPLOYMENT

Rwampara District recorded an overall unemployment rate of 6.4% among persons aged 14–64 years. Youth Not in Employment, Education, or Training (NEET) was critically high at 45.0% for the 18–30 age group and 37.2% for the 15–24 age group, indicating a significant youth employment challenge. Mwizi Subcounty recorded the highest NEET rate at 54.9% for the 18–30 age group, followed by Kabura Town Council at 49.4%.

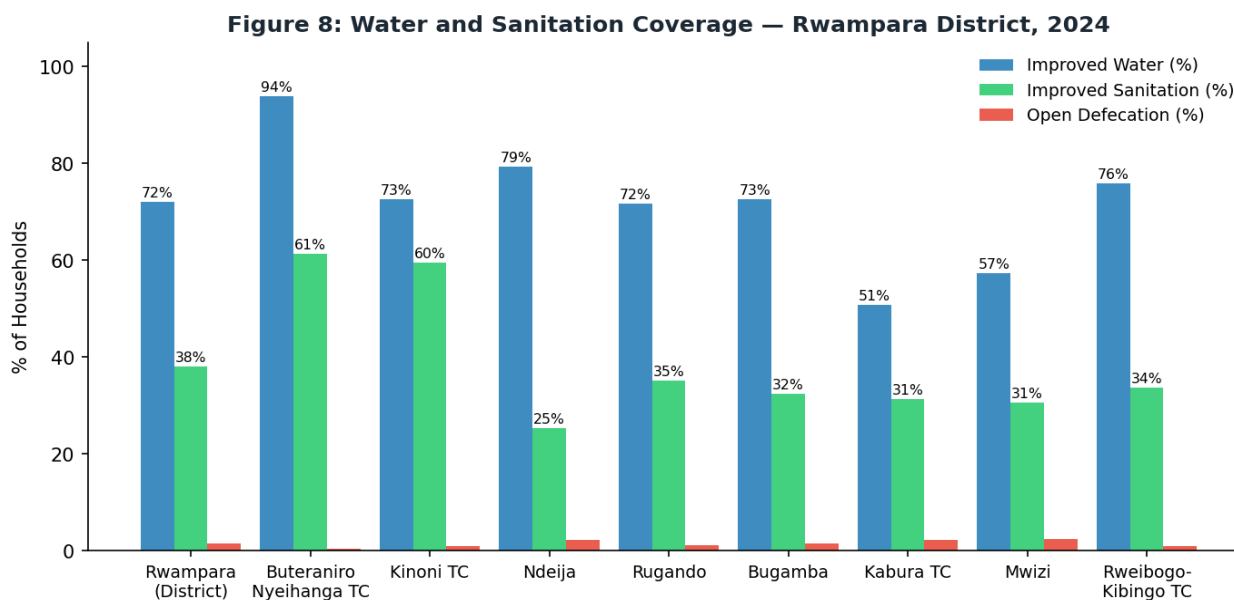

## 6. WATER AND SANITATION

Of the 36,273 households in Rwampara District, 26,105 (72.0%) had access to improved water sources. Sanitation coverage was more challenging, with only 13,820 households (38.1%) using improved sanitation facilities. A total of 569 households (1.6%) practised open defecation — particularly concentrated in Mwizi (172 cases) and Bugamba (105 cases) subcounties. Kabura Town Council had the lowest improved water access at only 50.8%.

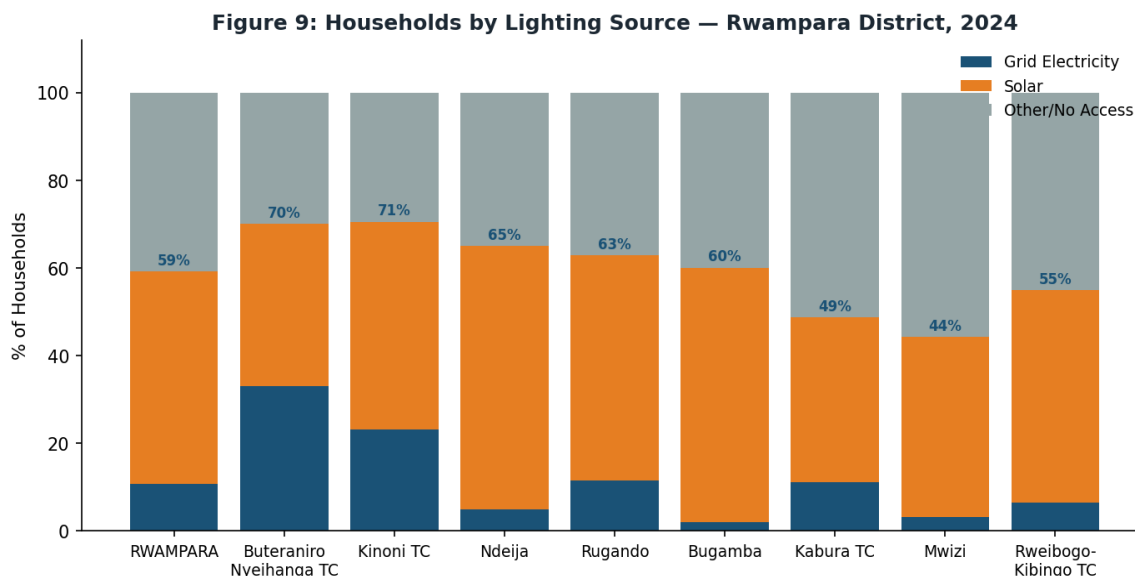

## 7. ENERGY FOR LIGHTING

A total of 21,462 households (59.2%) used solar energy or electricity for lighting — 3,931 from the national grid and 17,531 using solar. Bugamba Subcounty had the highest solar usage (4,012 households), while Buteraniro-Nyeihanga Town Council recorded the highest grid electricity use. Kabura Town Council and Mwizi Subcounty had below-average clean energy access, suggesting priority areas for electrification.

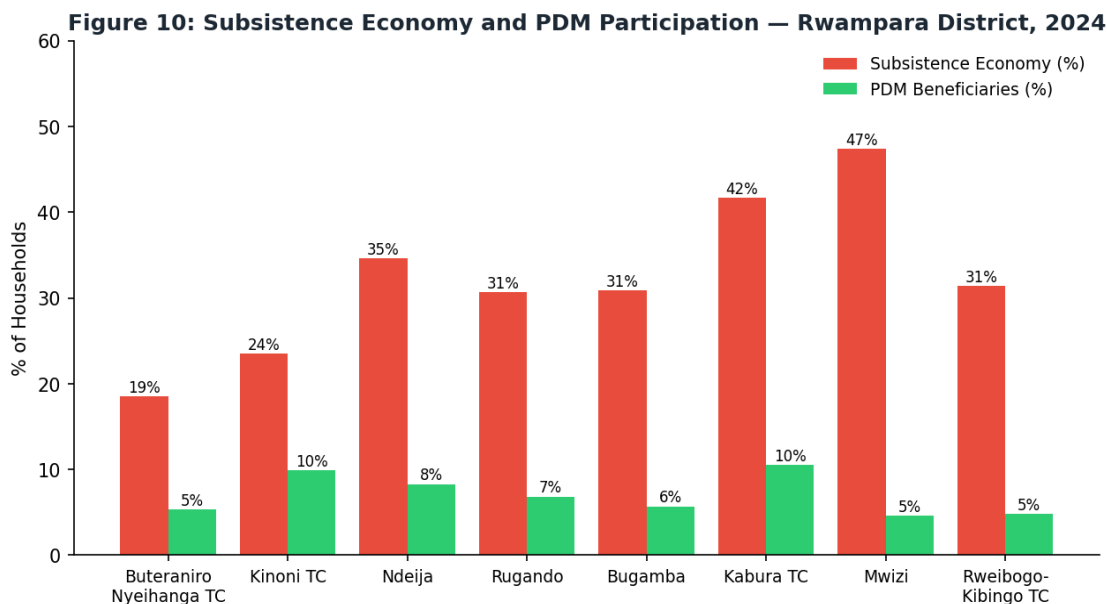

## 8. SUBSISTENCE ECONOMY AND PDM

A total of 11,964 households (33.0%) were classified as being in the subsistence economy, with Mwizi Subcounty recording the highest count at 3,321 households (47.4%). Only 2,401 households (6.6%) benefited from the Parish Development Model (PDM) programme, indicating significant room for expansion of PDM interventions, particularly in Mwizi and Bugamba subcounties.

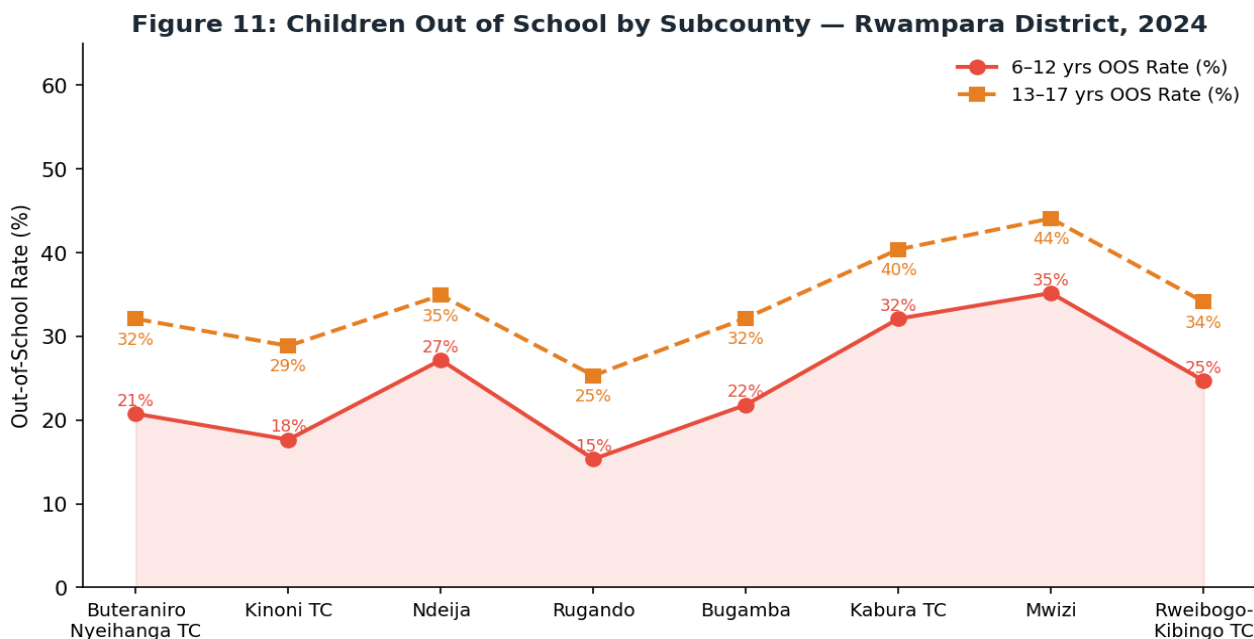

## 9. EDUCATION — CHILDREN OUT OF SCHOOL

A total of 7,161 children aged 6–12 years (25.5% of 28,091) were out of school in Rwampara District. Among adolescents aged 13–17 years, 6,756 (34.9% of 19,377) were out of school. Pre-primary attendance was also low, with 5,425 children aged 3–5 years not attending ECCE programmes. Mwizi Subcounty had the highest out-of-school count for both 6–12 (2,195) and 13–17 year-olds (1,791).
